

BYLAW 1.2022

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF HEAVY HAUL TRUCKS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Rosthern No. 403 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

PART I – SHORT TITLE

1. This bylaw shall be known as the "The Rural Municipality of Rosthern Municipal Speed Bylaw".

PART II – DEFINITIONS

- 2. For the purpose of this bylaw:
 - a) **Heavy Haul Trucks:** means all motor vehicles with a combined weight of vehicle, trailer and load of 10t or greater.
 - b) **Municipality:** means the Rural Municipality of Rosthern No. 403, Council, its employee or employees whose employment requires them to undertake certain works under this Bylaw.
 - c) **Municipal Road:** means a road used by the general public for passage of vehicles and does not include a provincial highway within the municipality, as designated pursuant to the provisions of "The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997".
 - d) **Speed Zone:** means any portion of a municipal road within the Rural Municipality of Rosthern No. 403, as designated herein, and identified by a sign erected and maintained at each end thereof, indicating the maximum speed applicable thereto.

PART III – PROVISIONS

- 3. No person shall operate a heavy haul truck at a speed greater than 60km/h on all municipal roads, as defined.
- 4. Speed zone signs indicating the maximum speed and weight shall be erected where appropriate.
- 5. Any person found guilty of the violation of speed limits set out in section 3 of this bylaw shall upon summary of conviction, be subject to the penalties set out in "The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997" and the regulation thereto as they relate to those traveling at a speed greater than which is permitted.

PART IV – COMING INTO FORCE

6. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the third and final reading.7. That Bylaw 7.2021 be repealed and replaced by this current Bylaw.
